## **The Orientation of Nurses in New Work Settings**

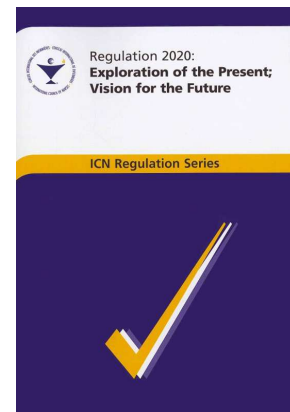

The ICN logo brings together the person (both the nurse and the people nurses serve) and the lamp, a symbol of nursing in many countries, representing the nurse working with people. Taken together, the four elements (base, lamp, flame and globe) represent unity, strength, wholeness and equilibrium. This modern logo reflects the dynamism and flexibility of ICN as an organisation.



### The White Heart badge

**The white heart** is the universal symbol for nursing. It characterizes the caring, knowledge and humanity that infuse the work and spirit of nursing. The white heart is also a unifying symbol for nurses globally.

White was selected because it brings together all colours, demonstrating nursing's acceptance of all people. White also has a worldwide association with nursing, caring, hygiene and comfort. The heart shape communicates humanity and the central place that nursing has in quality health care.
